The Aleph Institute is a non-profit Jewish religious, educational, and humanitarian organization offering services to imprisoned men and women and their families.



Program Requirements

- Participants must show remorse for their past behavior and sincere interest and motivation to become a productive member of society.
- Participants must be ready to work with community/faith leaders to change for the better.
- Participants must be willing to be in the program for 18 months and agree to comply with program requirements.

Rehabilitative tools, make for a more productive individual and a safer, healthier society

The Participants will agree to:

- A) Weekly meetings with their pastor/rabbi/lay leader, designed to lead the participant toward a more meaningful and reformed life, avoiding actions that are associated with destructive behavior.
- B) Community service weekly, at a local non-profit, with the goal of being a productive member of society.
- C) Employment retention, although a challenging feat during the pre-sentencing stage, due to uncertainty about the future. However, the participant will meet with career counseling agencies with the goal of obtaining employment.
- D) Working with a mentor who can provide support, guidance and direction.
- E) Meeting monthly with the ASP program leader who oversees the progress of the program and provides monthly reports on each participant to the court.

ASP is designed as a collaborative effort among social service agencies, local faith-based organizations, business partners, foundations, and US parole. We intend to work with individuals from all faith backgrounds to provide a holistic approach to alternative sentencing.

The participant (offender) is interviewed and accepted into the program after agreeing to change their life habits and agreeing to become a productive member of society.
